PRESENTATIONS AND APPEARANCES

A) Presentation by Material Resources – Road Condition Survey

- Colby Moore with Material Resources came before the Council to give a presentation about the road condition survey that was conducted on the Parish roads. He stated that Material Resources does pavement preservation and have been doing this in the Parish since 2009. They seal cracks in the road and check the condition of the roads. They road the entire Parish and used their technology to tract the conditions of the road and Iberville has a score of 86/100. He stated that the roads are in good condition and the score reflects that. He gave the Council a print out of all the roads and the assessment of the roads. He thanked the Council for their time.

PRESIDENT’S REPORT

President Daigle reported on the following:

- He stated that he would like to recognize Giles Hillery for 5 years of service, he stated in IPRD and has since moved to the Solid Waste department.

- He stated that the ITEP Committee met for the first time earlier in the day, the ITEP committee is how ITEP will be assessed under the new rules from Governor Jeff Landry.
- He stated that the first annual Iberville Day at the Capitol was a huge success and looks forward to doing it again next year. He also stated that the American Idol hometown visit for John Foster was a huge success and that May 14, 2025 was proclaimed ‘John Foster Day’ in Iberville Parish.
- He stated that Tullier Services Contractors have the contract for the Railroad Bore project and that work should begin soon. Also, the permits have been approved by Union Pacific to start clearing HWY 1 by Dow and that work should begin on June 2.
- The new bathrooms at the IPRD Parks are going out for bid at the beginning of June and bid will also go out for speed limit caution signs to be placed in different areas of the Parish.
- He stated that there area few upcoming events in the Parish, June 19 is the Juneteenth Event at the Civic Center, June 2, Camp 360 starts, and June 13 is the Plaquemine Locks Grand reopening.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Finance Director, Randall Dunn stated that each council members received budget to actual financial statements. He stated that the key takeaway that the sales tax collection is down and he attribute that to the state of the economy nationwide. He stated that the audit is ongoing and that it will be completed on time.

A) Introduction of Ordinances

1) Ordinance to adopt the millage rates for the tax year 2025

B) Consider conceptual approval of the Grand Oaks Apartments project, proposed to be located on Belleview Road

- Evan Alvarez, representing the Parish, came before the Council to give a brief explanation of what the conceptual approval of the Grand Oaks apartment project would mean for the Parish.
- David Strange with Grand Oaks Apartments came before the Council to give another brief presentation at 58805 Belleview Road in Plaquemine. The apartment complex would be 68 units, on 9 acres, ranging from 1 to 3 bedrooms, the rent is based on income. (A copy of the presentation is available upon request in the Council Office.) Some of the Council expressed that they would support this project if it were in another location, they just feel that on the proposed location is not what is best for the Parish.
- LesAnn Kirkland came before the Council and stated that something is needed in the community for the elderly but she doesn't believe that a 68-unit complex is the right move. She also feels that the community should have been given more notice about the proposed project.
- Ron Doyle came before the Council in opposition of this project, he stated that the traffic on the Belleview would be increased and that the traffic going to St. John School and Plaquemine High would be dangerous for those going to and from school in the mornings and evenings.
- GW Son came before the Council in opposition of this project, he stated that he doesn't think that the project should be in that area unless it was a smaller number of apartment but 68 apartments is too many for the proposed site. He also stated that he would be in support of the project if it were in a different area because of the traffic going to and from the schools in the area.

WHEREAS, ITEP contracts should be premised upon job and payroll creation or retention at new or expanded manufacturing plants or establishments, and that the percentage of exemption be 80% for a term of five years, renewable for an additional term of five years from ad valorem taxes in accordance with guidance received from the Secretary of Economic Development and concurred in by the appropriate parish and/or municipal council, school board, and sheriff; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, upon consideration of the foregoing and the public discussion held this day, that the IBERVILLE PARISH COUNCIL approves the terms of the Industrial Tax Exemption contract (the Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the State of Louisiana, the Louisiana Department of Economic Development, and SHINTECH LOUISIANA, LLC to the Industrial Tax Exemption contract between the Board of Commerce and Industry and SHINTECH LOUISIANA, LLC with respect to the drilling of a new Brine Well. BE IT RESOLVED by the Iberville Parish Council (the "Governing Authority"), acting as the governing authority of the Parish of Iberville, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), that:

SECTION 1. Canvass. This Governing Authority does now proceed in open and public session to examine the official tabulations of votes cast at the special election held in the Parish of Iberville, State of Louisiana, on Saturday, May 3, 2025 (the "Election"), to authorize the renewal of a special tax therein pursuant to the following proposition (the "Proposition"):

MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSITION

Shall the Parish of Iberville, State of Louisiana (the "Parish"), continue to levy a special tax of 4 mills (the "Tax") on all the property subject to taxation within the Parish (an estimated \$4,871,000 reasonably expected at this time to be collected from the levy of the tax for an entire year), for a period of 15 years, beginning with the year 2026 and ending with the year 2040, for the purpose of supporting the maintenance, operation and capital expenditures necessary to administer the Iberville Parish Public Library and its branches, and shall the avails of proceeds of the Tax be administered by the Iberville Parish Library Board of Control, in the manner required by law?

This Governing Authority does further proceed to examine and canvass the returns of the Election thereof.

SECTION 2. Election Results. According to the official certified tabulation of votes cast at said Election, there was a total of **1,480** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** the Proposition and a total of **496** votes cast **AGAINST** the Proposition, resulting in a majority of **984** votes cast **IN FAVOR OF** the Proposition. The Proposition was therefore duly **CARRIED** by a majority of the votes cast by the qualified electors voting at the Election.

SECTION 3. Promulgation of Election Result. The results of said election shall be promulgated by publication in the manner provided by law, after receipt from the Secretary of State's office of the actual costs of the election, as required by §18:1292 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended.

SECTION 4. Declaration. The foregoing results of the Election are hereby declared by this Governing Authority and shall be published as required by law.

SECTION 5. Procès Verbal. A *Procès Verbal* of the canvass of the returns of the Election shall be made and a certified copy thereof shall be forwarded to the Secretary of State, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, who shall record the same in her office; another certified copy thereof shall be forwarded to the Clerk of Court and *Ex-Officio* Recorder of Mortgages in and for the Parish of Iberville, who shall record the same in the Mortgage Records of said Parish; and another copy thereof shall be retained in the archives of this Governing Authority.
