The Utilities Tech II will be mainly responsible for maintaining our multiple sewer package plants throughout the parish, assisting in the maintenance of sewer lift station pumps and wet wells. The technician will frequently travel around the parish.

Responsibilities

Job duties include, but are not limited to:

- Maintaining daily operation of multiple sewer package plants.
- Maintenance on all aeration blowers, pumps, and other equipment at said sewer package plants on a routine basis.
- Daily and weekly testing for BOD, TSS, PH, etc.
- Collect monthly, quarterly, bi-annual, and annual discharge samples.
- When needed, take on water and gas service calls.
- Assist colleagues when needed to ensure efficient daily operation throughout the department.
- Report any issues or concerns to supervisors promptly for resolution.

Qualifications

- Wastewater Certifications (2) preferred but not required.
- Experience in Wastewater field.
- Experience in/with natural gas is preferred but not required.
- Experience in/with potable water is preferred but not required.
- Ability to work safely and effectively.
- Ability to lift or carry 50+/- lbs. daily.
- Ability to bend or squat for random periods of time.

OTHER DUTIES AS ASSIGNED

Employees may be assigned additional responsibilities or tasks deemed necessary by management to meet the operational requirements of the organization.

ESSENTIAL WORKER STATEMENT

Certain positions within this classification may require incumbents to be on-call 24/7. These roles are designated as essential, and individuals may be required to report to work during emergency situations as necessary.

CERTIFICATIONS/LICENSES/REGISTRATIONS

Positions within this classification may require a valid Louisiana driver's license or a valid Louisiana Commercial Driver's License (CDL) Class A, B, or C with the necessary endorsements. If a license is required, it must be maintained for the duration of employment in this position.
